

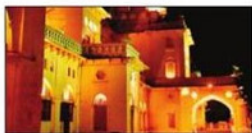
## लविवि में 25 विभागों ने बनाए यू-ट्यूब चैनल

लखनऊ। लॉकडाउन के दौरान हो रहे पढ़ाई के नुकसान को पूरा करने के लिए लखनऊ विश्वविद्यालय ने यू-ट्यूब चैनल के जरिए विद्यार्थियों को पढ़ाई शुरू की है। लविवि के 43 विभागों में से अब तक 25 ने अपने-अपने यू-ट्यूब चैनल बना लिए हैं। इन चैनलों पर अब तक 160 शिक्षकों ने करीब 600 लेक्चर अपलोड कर दिए हैं।

कुलपति ने समिति की ली ऑनलाइन बैठक कुमार राय को यह जानकारी सोमवार को ई-कंटेंट की मॉनिटरिंग के लिए बनाई गई समिति ने दी। प्रो. एय ने सोमवार को समिति के साथ जूम एप के माध्यम से ऑनलाइन बैठक की।

लविवि की अधिष्ठाता छात्र कल्याण और समिति की अध्यक्ष प्रो. पुनम टंडन ने बताया कि ई-कंटेंट पर अच्छा काम किया जा रहा है। इस समय काफी विद्यार्थी इसका लाभ उठा रहे हैं। कोरोना वायरस से संक्रमण के खतरे को देखते हुए सभी लविवि और कालेज पहले से ही बंद हैं। ऐसे में तकनीक का उपयोग करके ही कक्षाएं संचालित हो सकती हैं। लविवि प्रशासन ने इसको देखते हुए ई-कंटेंट की दिशा में तेजी से काम शुरू किया है। जिन विभागों ने अभी तक अपने यहां का यू-ट्यूब चैनल नहीं बनाया है उनसे

ई-कंटेंट भले ही लखनऊ विश्वविद्यालय के शिक्षक तैयार कर रहे हैं पर यह सुविधा सभी के लिए है। लविवि परिसर के साथ ही कॉलेज के विद्यार्थी भी इनका लाभ उठा सकते हैं। इसके लिए उन्हें लविवि की वेबसाइट पर जाना होगा।

प्रो. आलोक कुमार राय, कुलपति, लविवि इसके लिए फिर से निर्देश दिया गया है। यू-ट्यूब चैनल बनाने में पेश आने वाली समस्या का समाधान भी किया जाएगा।

वहीं, लखनऊ विश्वविद्यालय में विभाग धीरे-धीरे तकनीक से कदमताल कर रहे हैं। मनोविज्ञान विभाग की बोर्ड ऑफ स्टडीज की बैठक भी बीते दिनों ऑनलाइन आयोजित की गई। लविवि प्रशासन ने विभागों के कामकाज में भी तकनीक को बढ़ावा देने को कहा है। इसी के तहत यह बदलाव हो रहे हैं।

## Classrooms locked down, LU teachers start 'OPD'

**Lucknow:** A few teachers of the Lucknow University have taken the online way to start 'Our Pupils' Day (OPD)' a programme scheduled from March third week, but which could not be initiated because of the lockdown.

Under the programme, a teacher has to reserve an hour on a designated day every week to counsel students on academic and personal issues. Students can walk-in to the teacher's chamber for one-to-one session. The twin objectives are to strengthen student-teacher bonding and help students to remain stress-free.

Without waiting for the lockdown to be over, teachers of some departments, including physics, journalism, law and mathematics have started OPDs through video calls. However, instead of one-to-one, most held group sessions. Individual counselling will be held later,

they said.

Prof Anurag Srivastava of law department devoted Sunday for counselling. "Students are worried about their future due to academic closure and needed to be assured that teachers would do everything possible to prevent the session from being delayed, he said.

Prof Poonam Tandon of physics department, who ran a group online OPD on Saturday, said "Around 38 students turned up for the session. Since most had concerns about unavailability of books due to the lockdown, we decided to make e-content and e-books available to them.

## Online classes to keep students engaged

As the country fights the COVID19 pandemic, teachers are doing their bit by conducting online classes for students. Media spokesperson of Lucknow University Durgesh Srivastava said the teachers are at the forefront of this with active online classes and e-content being prepared by more than 160 faculty members.

Prof Poonam Tandon held the first online OPD (Our Pupils' Day) with 38 students via ZOOM and initiated the whole process. She said that even essential meetings are being held online. She gave the example of the department of Psychology which recently held a meeting via video-conferencing.

The university website is currently hosting e-content from these faculty members, all open access for ease of use and availability to students.

"Several faculty members also have their own websites where they are hosting content as well as classes, and are using various classroom hosting websites to conduct regular classes," the media spokesperson pointed out.

Dr Kiranlata Dangwal said that teachers of the department of Education have been using platforms like Google Classroom, EDMODO, Padlet, ZOOM, WizIQ and others as educational tools for a long time. Similarly, Prof RK Mishra from the department of Biochemistry has created a website which has content for MSc (Biochemistry) and MSc (Biotechnology). It has had

more than 495 visits in the last five days itself.

Prof Leena Burman from the department of Physics, Dr Alka Misra (department of Maths and Astronomy), Dr Garima Bisaria (department of Library Science), Prof Sudhir Mehrotra and Dr Ashutosh Singh (department of Biochemistry), Prof Rajeev Pandey and Dr Ashok Kumar (department of Statistics), Dr Puneet Mishra (department of Computer Science), Dr Ritu Narang (department of Business Administration), Prof Madhurima Pradhan and Dr Navina Wadhvani (department of Psychology), Prof Audhesh Tripathi (department of Commerce) and Dr Varun Chhachhar (Faculty of Law) have all been using ZOOM and Google Classroom applications to conduct their classes, give assignments and even clear doubts of their students.

Meanwhile, LU Vice-Chancellor Prof AK Rai has constituted a committee for formulation of modalities for online activities during the lockdown. Poonam Tandon from the department of Physics, Audhesh Tripathi from the department of Commerce and Kiran Lata Dangwal from the department of Education have been given responsibilities for compliance of various online activities and whenever a new opportunity or idea presents itself, it is natural to discuss, sound it out, and ask questions, said the media spokesperson of LU.

On Monday, Rai conducted an online meeting using Zoom app with all three members.
