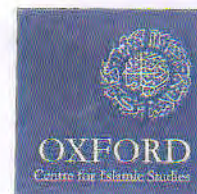

The Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies promotes excellence in the study of Islam and Muslim societies. Applications are invited for Visiting Research Fellowships tenable at the Centre for the academic year commencing October 2022.

There Visiting Research Fellowships, open to citizens of countries in Asia or Africa, are intended to encourage interaction among academics from different traditions of learning. Preference will be given to those studying classical Islamic sciences, although other areas in the humanities and social sciences will be considered.

Applicants should normally be at the postdoctoral level or equivalent.

The Visiting Research Fellowship carries a stipend of £4000, intended as a supplementary award, which may be held in conjunction with other research grants, stipends, or sabbatical salaries. Visiting Research Fellows will be provided with an office space, membership of the Common Room including use of the Centre's dining facilities, and assistance with finding residential accommodation.

Visiting Research Fellows are expected to devote their time to research and writing and to participate in the Centre's academic activities.

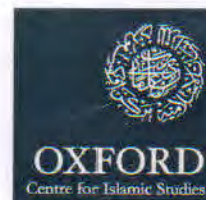

The Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies promotes excellence in the study of Islam and Muslim societies. Applications are invited for Visiting Fellowships tenable at the Centre for the academic year commencing in October 2022.

Two Visiting Fellowships are offered to support research in any area of the arts, humanities or social sciences that has relevance to the study of Islam or the Muslim world, particularly anthropology, economics, geography, history, international relations, law, literature, philosophy, politics, religion, and sociology.

Applicants would normally be established academics but scholars at the postdoctoral level are also eligible.

The Visiting Fellowship provides a stipend of £5000, intended as a supplementary award, which may be held in conjunction with other research grants, stipends, or sabbatical salaries. Visiting Fellows will be provided with an office space, membership of the Common Room including use of the Centre's dining facilities, and assistance with finding residential accommodation.

Visiting Fellows are expected to devote their time to research and writing and to participate in the Centre's academic activities.

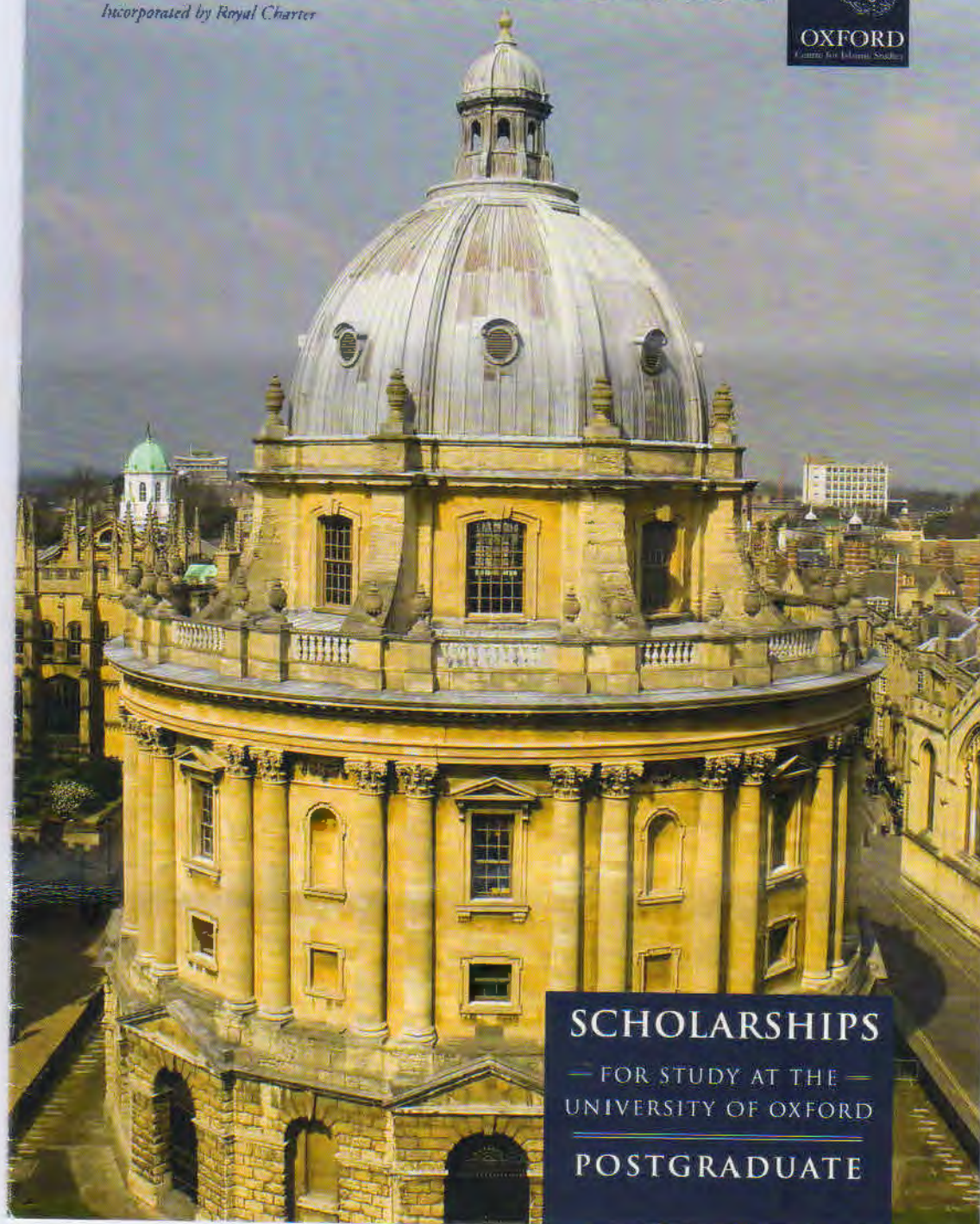

The Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies (OCIS) is offering up to five OCIS Postgraduate (PG) Scholarships to students applying to undertake graduate study at the University of Oxford (other than for postgraduate certificate or postgraduate diploma courses, part-time courses, or non-matriculated courses). The awards will be available to students ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom and from a Muslim community, and students who are nationals of, and ordinarily resident in, one of a number of countries in Asia and Africa (listed opposite). The awards cover University fees and include a maintenance grant. Awards may be offered in conjunction with other sources of funding, although that will be taken into account when determining the value of the award.

Purpose of Scholarships

The purpose of the OCIS Postgraduate Scholarships is to encourage students to pursue studies that will be of benefit to Muslim society. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of academic merit. For those candidates ordinarily resident in the UK and from a Muslim community, a preference will be given to those from a financially disadvantaged background. Applicants must be able to show how their intended course of study is relevant to the Muslim world.

Closing Date

The deadline for applications for OCIS Postgraduate Scholarships coincides with the University of Oxford's January application deadline. See the website below for details.
