
Steps in Standardization of Test

- There are four steps in standardization of any Psychological test
- 1. Planning
- 2. Preparation of test items
- 3. Tryout
- 4. Final draft

First Step- Planning

- 1. specify the course or unit content
- 2. List the major objective
- 3. define each objective in term of terminal behaviour
- 4.Prepare a table of specification.
- 5. Type of items (objective/ essay)
- Prepare the test items

Factors to be consider when selecting an item format

- Purpose of the test
- Time available to prepare or scoring
- The number of pupils to be tested
- The physical facilities available
- Teacher's skill

Second Stage –Preparing of test items

- 1. Formulate well defined questions
- 2.Write each test item on a separate card
- 3. Prepare a scoring key
- 4. Prepare more items then we actually needed
- 5. Item should be written after the completion of course or unit
- 6. Items should be given to reviewers

Arrangement of Items

- 1. True/ false Type
- 2. Matching type
- 3. Multiple choice type
- 4. Interpretative Type
- 5. Short answer type
- 6. Essay type

Organization of test Items

- 1. From Easy to difficult
- 2. Group the items with in each section
- 3. writing the test Instructions

Stage Third - tryout

- 1. Selection of sample to be tested
- 2. Selection of items to be included in final version
- 3. Administration of the test.
- 4. A record of the time taken to complete each sub test.
 - 5. Listing of test booklet used at each grade

Stage forth- Final Draft

In fourth stage we have to pass the test through following processes.

- 1. statistical Item analysis
- 2. Reliability
- 3. Validity
- 4. Norms
- 5. Final draft or test

Some other points to keep in mind

- 1. If the number of examine is large than Test should be standardized. Standardized test should have it's Reliability, validity, Norm, Objectivity etc
- 2. If the number of examine is small then test should be teacher made.
